

Bay Area home prices have exploded


Bay Area prices vs. California and the nation


San Francisco and LA have the most renters

Bay Area has the lowest rates of renter stress


Renters spending more than half their income on rent






Renter stress often higher where rents are lower

Renter stress is more about income...


Median household income of renters, \$

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Housing stress is about options

- How to address stress?
 - Cheaper place in same community
 - Share costs with others
 - Cheaper place in different community

Higher-income stressed have all three options

• Lower-income stressed have only the second two options, if any



People are leaving the Bay Area...


Bay Area migration flows, 2021-2022

...especially at lower income levels


Bay Area migration rates by income, 2021-2022


Higher-income leavers often work remotely...
