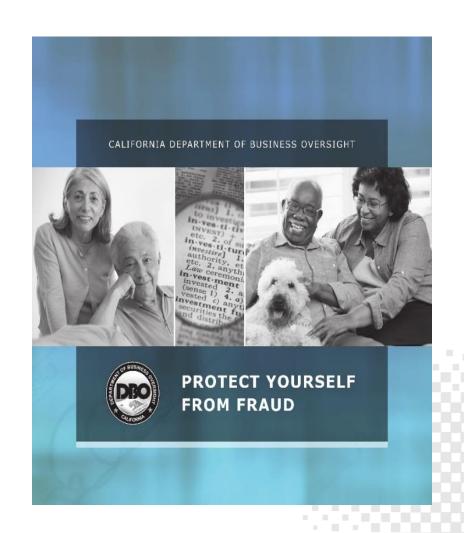

 - Entirely online

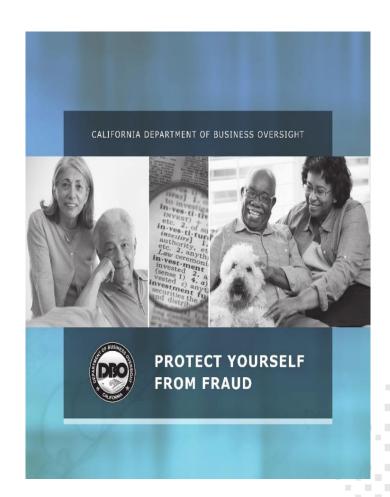


Protecting Yourself From Fraud: Defense Tips
